Factiva

- Read the latest news from top business sources like *The Wall Street Journal*, *New York Times*, and *Fortune* at-a-glance with the News Pages.
- Find U.S. and non-U.S. public company information using Company Quick Search
- Search for articles from 9000 national and international newspapers and magazines such as *The Financial Times* and *The Economist*

Economist Intelligence Unit (EIU)

Viewswire

- Delivers daily global business news, economic data and analysis
- Highlights 250 key economic, political, and market developments around the world
- Draws from the Economist Intelligence Units (EIU) premium content, including country profiles and risk ratings, and regional newsletters

Industry Briefing

- Provides five-year forecasts and news analysis for eight key industries, along with relevant background information
- Covers the 60 major economies that account for more than 95% of world output and trade

Business Book Reviews

- Free access to 100 word summaries of many popular business books.
- Categories include business strategy, entrepreneurship, global business, innovation, IT, leadership, management, marketing, and social responsibility.
- Previous books reviews are accessible in the Alumni Library Information conference on First Class.

Google Tips

- **Site:org**
Eliminate many commercial website results. Add site:org (for organizations) or site:gov (for government sties) to your search. Google will only retrieve information from URLs with that ending. For example, **real estate site:gov** retrieves information from the BLS, HUD and other government departments
- **Synonyms (~)**
If you are searching for a word that has several common synonyms, use the tilde sign before the term to include synonyms. For example, **~equity** - retrieves pages with matches to: stocks, investments, and capital. You can also combine this with other search terms
- **Define:**
Want a quick definition to a word or acronym? Google will search glossaries, dictionaries and thesauruses. For example, **define:msa** will give you several definitions as to how the census defines a metropolitan statistical area, as well as other things MSA could stand for

Business Research Resources

- In response to questions from alumni, business librarians have identified several excellent free and fee sources of information available through online that address common information needs
- Recommended links are available for: SEC Filings, associations, rankings and lists, market research and investment banking
