#### ◆ Conference Board Economic Analysis

Includes the CB's own indicators (e.g. consumer confidence, U.S. leading index) and forecasted economic indicators (GDP, CPI, etc.)

- ◆ Economic News – daily news sources
- ◆ Global Business Cycle Indicators – leading, coincident, and lagging indexes designed to signal peaks and troughs in the business cycle for nine countries
- ◆ StraightTalk - Chief Economist's monthly research, analysis and forecasts geared toward helping business executives assess economic conditions and impact on global markets

- ◆ Extensive collection of current and historical data maintained by the Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis
- ◆ View in graph or download into Excel
- ◆ Includes CPI, Employment, GDP, Interest Rates, PPI, US Financial Data, and more

- ◆ Includes: large/small company stocks, long-term corporate and government bonds, U.S. treasury bills, inflation

- ◆ Forecasted data going out 10 years of key economic indicators including CPI, PPI, Inflation, GDP, and Treasury Rates
